<i>High quality:</i> Further research is very unlikely to change confidence of the estimate	<i>The trade-offs:</i> Taking into account the estimated size of the effect for main outcomes, the confidence limits around those estimates and the relative value placed on each outcome
<i>Moderate quality:</i> Further research is likely to have an impact on confidence in the estimate of effect and may change the estimate	<i>The quality of the evidence</i>
<i>Low quality:</i> Further research is very likely to have an important impact on confidence in the estimate of the effect and is likely to change the estimate	<i>Translation of the evidence into practice in a particular setting:</i> Taking into consideration important factors that could be expected to modify the size of expected effects
<i>Very low quality:</i> Any estimate of effect is uncertain	<i>Uncertainty about the baseline risk for the population of interest</i>
