"For example, the concept of "harmful use of alcohol" is highly problematic. It's a term that is confusing and supports the narrative and myths of the alcohol industry. The term disguises both the real magnitude of the alcohol burden (see above) as well as the motives of the alcohol industry for the public and policy makers. (...)
