

SUPPLEMENTAL TABLE 5 Instructions for Participants in the Breast Pump Group

Reasons to Use the Manual Breast Pump

- 1. Feeling uncomfortably engorged (breasts are firm and painful) or baby having difficulty latching due to engorgement
- 2. To express milk to give extra milk to your baby after feeding at breast
- 3. To express milk to store to give your baby later (for example, if you are away from your baby for a short period of time)
- 4. Separated from baby when baby would usually feed and desire to empty breasts to stimulate continued milk production
